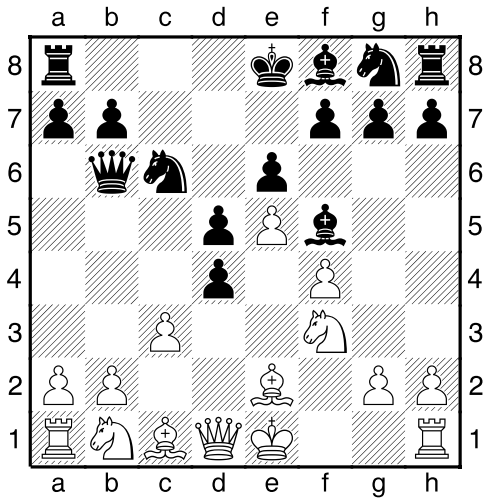

1. Akolkar - Aliens243

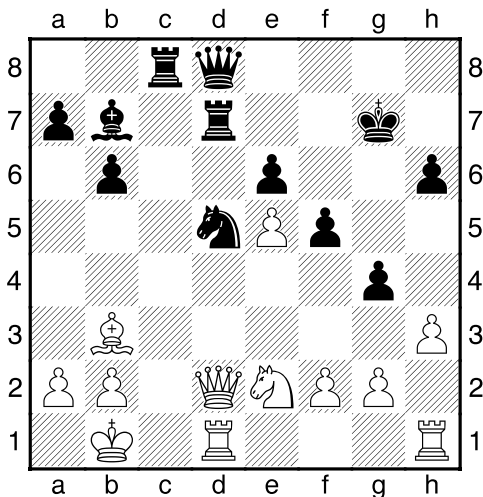


8. cxd4 Bxb1 9. Rxb1 Bb4+ 10. Bd2

2. Proloy – Eduardo Lucas

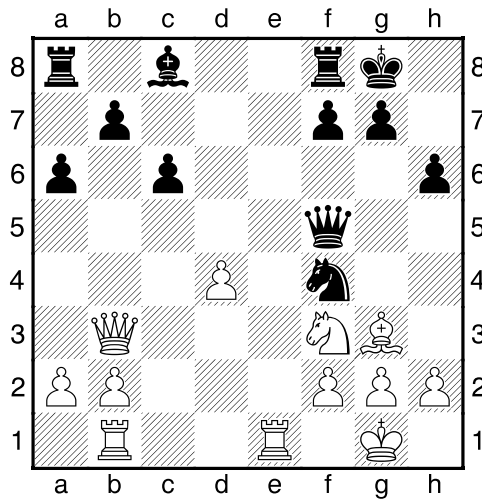


23. Ka1 Qg5 24. Nf4 Kf7 25. hxg4

3. Blunderer - Supergrobi

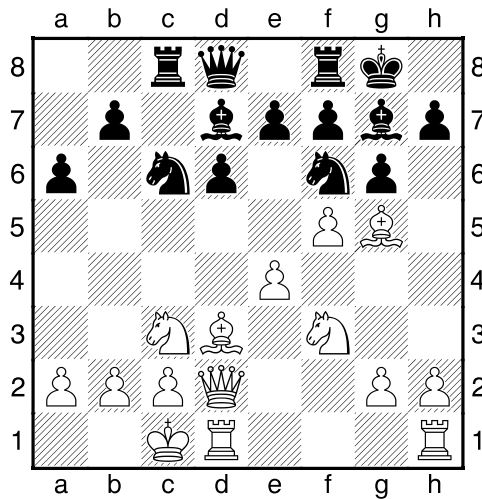


22. Rbd1 Ng6 23. d5 cxd5 24. Rxd5

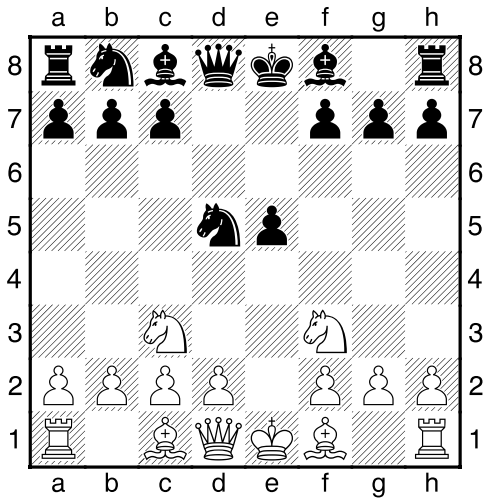
Find the blunder:

- a) fxg6 b) Nd5 c) a3

Find the best move:

Always look for the best move: it could be a mating line, a move that just wins a pawn, or a move that lets you keep in the game a bit more.

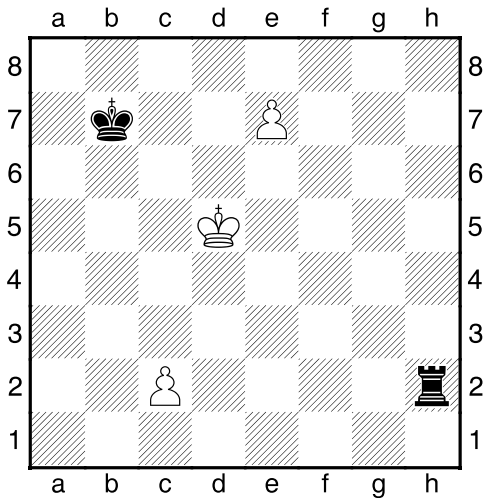
5.NeuroDoc - HalfPatz



5.Nxe5 Nxc3 6.bxc3 Bd6 7.Qe2 Nc6

White to play

6.TripleBrain - kalten



Black to play and win

Answers:

1.

The blunder is: ...**Nxd4**. Lets see why:

10...Nxd4 11.Nxd4 Qxd4 and now the intermediate move **12.Qa4+** wins a tempo (and a piece).

2.

The blunder is ...**Qxf4**.

25...Qxf4 26.Qxf4 Nxf4 (the Knight was overloaded) **27.Rxd7+ Kg6 28.Rxb7**

3.

There are two blunders here:

24...Be6 25.Rxf5 Bxb3 26.axb3 winning a Bishop and:

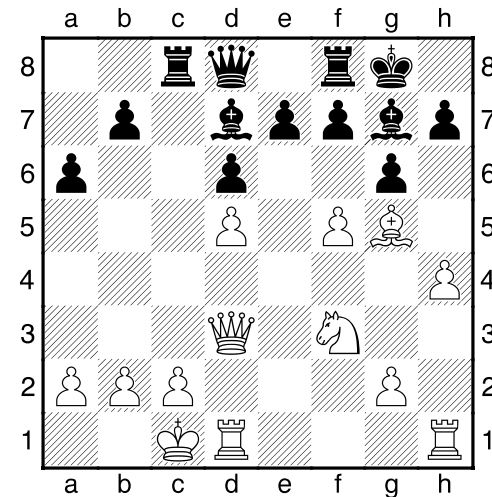
24...Qg4 25.h3 and the Black Queen has no free squares to go!

4.

Nd5 is the blunder, which is not obvious why. Lets see:

15.Nd5 Nfxd5. Fritz says that White is already lost from e1 to e2. White will enter in zugzwang. and that he should not take back the Knight. But to

make things simpler lets take it (If White doesn't take it, he loses a piece). **16.exd5 Nxd3+ 17.Qxd3**



And Black has a lot of threats.

17...Bxf5 18.Qb3 Rxc2+ 19.Qxc2 Bxc2 20.Kxc2.

And Black exchanged a Rook and a Knight for a Queen a 2 pawns and with the White King exposed.

5.

8.Nxc6+ winning the Queen

6.

59...Re2 60.Kd6 Kc8! If White moves his King, he loses his "e" pawn, so White must advance his "c" pawn. In the meantime Black can move his Rook
